Terry Lee Nordby was born Aug. 1, 1950 at Manning. He was baptized in St. Paul Lutheran church in Irwin. As a young boy he grew up in the Harlan, Irwin and Denison areas. Later the family moved to Mo. Valley, where he attended school. In Sept. of 1970 he entered the U.S. Army and served two years. One year was served as a squad leader in Viet Nam. While in Viet Nam he received two Bronze Stars, Bronze Star medal, National Defense service medal, Viet Nam Service medal, Republic of Viet Nam Campaign medal, Army Commendation medal, Air medal, Combat Infantry Badge and a sharp shooter badge.
