

## The Life Story of —

**Hazel D. Robertson, 80**

Hazel Dell Robertson, daughter of Chris and Anna Mason Johnson, was born in Avoca, on May 22, 1896. She died at Immanuel Lutheran hospital in Omaha, Nebr., on June 28, 1976, at age 80 years, one month and 6 days. She attended schools in Avoca and Shelby, graduating from Shelby high school in 1914. On June 14, 1914, she married Frank Lewis (Jimmy) Robertson at Shelby. Eight children were born to this union. Mr and Mrs Robertson were privileged to share 58 years together before his death in 1973. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Robertson made their home in Shelby. In 1950 they moved to Harlan. While in Harlan, Mrs Robertson was a seamstress for Farners and the Golden Rule and also did alterations in her home. In 1961 they went to Rawlins, Wyo., and lived there for 5 years. They then moved to Omaha, Nebr., and this has been her home since that time. Mrs Robertson had been a long time member of the First Presbyterian church in Shelby. She was active in the Women's Society and also taught Sunday school. She was a past president of the Shelby American Legion Auxiliary.

In addition of her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by two infant sons and by a brother, Robert Johnson. She is survived by three sons - Victor of Rawlins, Wyo., Vance of Council Bluffs, and Gary of Atlantic; three daughters - Betty Doyle of Lincoln, Shirley (Mrs Arthur Cox) and Joann (Mrs Don Sahl) both of Omaha; 16 grandchildren; great grand-children; a sister Velma (Mrs Harry Rounsley) of Omaha; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at First Presbyterian church, Shelby, on Wednesday, June 30, 1976 with Rev. Larry Watkins, pastor of the Presbyterian church in Neola, officiating. Burial was in the Shelby cemetery, with Kevin Sahl, Jeffrey Cox, Michael Cox, Dean Luxford, Tracy Robertson, and Everette Starner serving as casketbearers.
