Arnold August Soll, son of William and Dora Boyens Soll, was born March 29, 1917, near Halbur. He attended country schools near Aspinwall and Manilla. He worked in Aspinwall and Manilla, and in 1935 he entered the CCC camp.

He married Alma Anderson on March 29, 1938. They farmed in the Manilla area until 1948, and in Audubon Co. until 1968, wthey they made their home in Elk Horn. He operated Soll's Repair Shop, and later was custodian of Elk Horn Creek Park. He died at Clarkson Memorial hospital, Omaha, on Thursday, Aug. 27, 1981 at age 64 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, an infant son Ronald, an infant grandson Mark, a brother William and a sister Hazel.
