Mary H. Stephany, 91

Harlan — Mary Helen Stephany, daughter of Albert and Helen Koffee Glawinski, was born in Pittsburgh, Penn., on Sept. 22, 1888. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic faith. As a young girl, she moved with her parents to Earling, where she attended St. Joseph's school and

In Jan. of 1906, she married Joseph Peter Stephany at St. Joseph's church in Earling. Ten children were born to this union. They made their home in Earling until 1928 when they moved to Panama. They lived in Panama until moving to Harlan in 1945. After Joseph's death in Dec. of 1949, Mary continued to make her home in Harlan until becoming a resident of Little Flower Haven in Earling in 1973 and this has been her home since that time. It was here that she died on Sunday, Feb. 3, 1980, at age 91 years, four months and 11 days. She had been a long time member of St. Michael's church in Harlan and was also a member of St. Katherine's Court No. 266, Catholic Daughters of America of Earling for many years.
