

Arthur L. Stofferson, 90

Harlan — Arthur Leslie Stofferson was born July 31, 1890, near Harlan, son of Chris N. Stofferson and Sadie Gillett Stofferson. He attended school in Center twp. and Western Iowa Vocational College in Harlan.

On Feb. 16, 1916, he married Esther Petersen. This union was blessed with three children. He lived in Shelby county his entire life. He was a charter member of the First Baptist church. Prior to his retirement he farmed and was a Livestock Order Buyer. He died Jan. 20, 1981, at the Baptist Memorial Home, at age 90 years, where he had been a resident since Nov., 1980.
