Portsmouth — Marilyn Stonier, daughter of Joe F. and Wanda Buman Jurschak, was born Sept. 19, 1942 at Portsmouth. She attended Cass county school and St. Mary's high school. Afterwards she attended the College of St. Mary's in Omaha. She married Russell Stonier in Chicago, Ill., on Aug. 31, 1979.

She was Shelby county dairy princess in 1961, Miss Press Photographer of the Year in 1965, and participated locally with two sisters in a singing group on t.v.

She was music librarian at WOW, Omaha for three years, did some modeling, and spent a year in Calif. In 1967 she was top salesperson for the Midwest Area for the Yellow Pages. In 1969, she moved to Chicago where she worked as a business consultant. She died in Chicago, Sunday, May 11, 1980 at age 37 years, 8 months and 22 days.

Survivors include her parents, three sisters - Karen Clark of Manchester, Mo.; Gwen Sidles of Scottsdale, Ariz., and Marlene Burnham of Beatrice, Neb., two brothers - Joseph A. and Kenneth J. Jurschak of Phoenix, Ariz., and other relatives.
