

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Charles C. Tierney, 86

Charles C. Tierney, son of James and Annie Loughery Tierney, was born in Walnut, March 8, 1896. He attended the Walnut school and for 34 years was employed by the Rock Island Railroad in the bridge and building department. Later he opened a recreation and billiards hall in Walnut. He never married. In 1979 he became a resident of Peace Haven, but his health failed and he moved to Colonial Manor Nursing Home in Avoca in 1982. He died Oct. 20 at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan.

Surviving are a sister-in-law, Anne Tierney of Walnut, nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters, Jane Tierney and Mary Leslie; six brothers, John, Thomas, Frank, William, Ed and Leo.
