A Short Life Story of Mrs. Christian Trottnner

Mrs. Christian Trottnner, whose death at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Matilda Danker of Oakland was mentioned in the Republican last week, was born at Laboe, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany, Oct. 2, 1865. Her maiden name was Emma Katherine Groepper.

She came to this country at the age of 16. After one year here she returned to Germany and later came back to this country with her parents to stay.

She was married to Christian Trottnner Nov. 13, 1886, at Minden, Iowa. To this union were born five children: Matilda Danker of Oakland; Henry F. of Oakland; Emma Baustian of Overton, Neb.; Rudolph and Amelia Trottnner of Shelby.

They lived one year at Yorkshire, then moved a to farm near Shelby, where they lived 38 years. They retired to Council Bluffs where they lived three years. Her husband died there after which she made her home with her children.

Beside the children, Mrs. Trottnner is survived by seven grandchildren, two brothers, William Groepper and Theodore Groepper of Minden, and two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Pieper and Mrs. Adolph Ehlers of Minden, and other relatives.
