

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Glenn Whitmore, 67

PERSIA — Glenn Samuel Whitmore was born east of Beebeetown on March 23, 1915 to Katie and Harry Whitmore. He was the fifth son of a family of seven children. He attended eight years of country school and graduated from Logan high school in 1932. This past year, he attended the 50 year class reunion at Logan.

On May 18, 1940 he married Edna Oloff of Persia. They moved to LuVern where he and his father operated a small dairy farm and crop farmed for two years. In the spring of 1942 they moved to a farm east of Woodbine and after 11 years moved to their present farm. He specialized in raising pure bred breeding stock for 30 years, besides being active in farming.

He participated in many community activities. They were honored by the booster club for their many years of hard work and faithful service. He was also an active member of the Kiwanis Club for several years and served on many of their committees. He died Thursday, Aug. 26, at the age of 67.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Harold and Francis. He is survived by his wife, Edna, one sister, Mrs Darrell (Norma Jean) Fahrenkrog, of Persia, three brothers, Frank of Watsonville, Calif., Clifford of Woodbine and Harry of Adel, and other relatives.

Services were held at the Woodbine R.L.D.S. church Sunday, Aug. 29, 1982 with burial at the Valley View Cemetery near Persia.
