

## The Life Story of -

Mrs Tena Williams, 79

**PORTSMOUTH** — Clementine Williams, known to everyone as Tena, daughter of William and Clementine Emyke Plambeck, was born on Mar. 17, 1895 on a farm in Harrison county. She died at her home in Portsmouth, on Febr. 22, 1975, at age 79 years, 11 months and 5 days. Tena attended country school and grew to adulthood on her father's farm. On June 2, 1920, she married Clyde Williams in Omaha, Nebr. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage they farmed near Portsmouth until Dec. of 1963. They then moved to their present home and after her husband's death on Jan. 3, 1974, she continued to make this her home. Mrs Williams attended the Methodist church.

Tena was preceded in death by her parents; five brothers - Harry, Ed, Richard, John and Bill; two sisters - Lena and Mary and one grandson - Donald Mickels. She is survived by one daughter - Mae (Mrs Alfred Mikels) of Woodbine, two sons - Russell and Laverne, both of Woodbine; 13 grandchildren and ten great grandchildren; by four sisters - Margaret (Mrs Fred Clausen), Anna (Mrs Charles Hammond) of Cheyenne, Wyo., Minnie (Mrs Harvey Nelson) of Harlan and Elma (Mrs Joe Patten) of Portsmouth, two brothers - Andrew Plambeck, of Persia, and Robert Plambeck, of Omaha, Nebr.; nieces and nephews and other relatives.
