

## The Life Story of --

### **DONALD D. WILLIAMS, 26**

Donald Dean Williams, Manilla, son of Raymond and Dorothy Leinen Williams, was born Jan. 1, 1950 at Manning, and died of injuries suffered in an auto accident, Feb. 24, 1976, at age 26 years, 1 month and 25 days. Mr Williams was raised in the Dunlap and Dow City area. He attended school in Dow City and later moved to Denison with his parents, where he was graduated from the Denison high school in 1968. He entered the U. S. Army in Aug. of 1969, serving for a year in Vietnam. After his discharge he returned to Denison, where he was employed at Farmland Foods Inc. On Mar. 3, 1973, he married Coleen Collins of Denison. They made their home in Denison until Dec. of 1975, when they moved to an acreage near Manilla, where he was in partnership with his brother-in-law, Ward Sebern in the Sebern Chevrolet Garage and Dealership at Manilla.

Survivors include his wife, Coleen, two children, Stacy Ann and Michael Alan, both at home, his parents, Mr and Mrs Raymond Williams of Harlan, five brothers, Kenny of Anaheim, Calif., Ray of Charter Oak, Neil of Omaha, Nebr., Phil of Defiance and Dally of Denison, five sisters, Rose Ann (Mrs Ernie Schnack) of Harlan, Betty (Mrs Ward Sebern) of Manilla, Colleen (Mrs Larry Nicholas) of Anaheim, Calif., Donna of Harlan and Jan (Mrs Jerry Hansen) of Harlan, his paternal grandmother, Mrs Mollie Williams of Persia and other relatives.

Funeral services were held, Friday, Feb. 27, 1976, in St. Rose of Lima Catholic church, Denison, with Father Lloyd White officiating.
