

THE LIFE STORY OF —

Bernard L. Wohlhutter, 50

Bernard Lee Wohlhutter, son of Edna M. Croft and Clarence E. Wohlhutter was born May 11, 1932, at Corley. He died Thursday, Dec. 16, 1982, at the Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan at the age of 50 years, 7 months and 5 days. In 1940, his family moved to a farm east of Kirkman, where he attended and graduated from the Kirkman high school in 1950.

On June 7, 1951, he married Delores Stolz in Harlan and to this union three children were born. He served four years in the U.S. Navy during the Korean Conflict aboard the U.S.S. Bauer, a mine layer out of Charleston, S.C. In 1955, they moved to a farm east of Kirkman where they farmed until moving to Harlan in 1969. He worked for A & P Appliance for the next 12 years and was forced to quit in 1980, due to being disabled by cancer.

He is survived by his wife Delores, two sons; Mike and Jim, all of Harlan; one daughter, Miss Mary E. Wohlhutter of Glenwood; his parents, Edna and Clarence Wohlhutter of Walnut; three grandchildren: Angela, Melanie and Michael. He is also survived by many nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Saturday, Dec. 18, 1982 at the Burmeister Funeral Home with Dr. Larry LaVelle officiating and military rites conducted by the American Legion Post No. 150 of Harlan. Burial was in the Rose Hill cemetery at Kirkman with Gary Allen, Paul Kruse, Steve Allen, Ray H. Larson, Quentin Rickers and Harvey Anderson serving as casketbearers.
