Funeral services for Mrs. Mary Florence Anderson, who died at her home near Cumming early Sunday, were held at the Galloway Funeral Home Tuesday afternoon in charge of the Rev. R. C. Priebe of Cumming. Burial was in the Orillia cemetery. Two sons, Walter and John and a daughter, Mrs. Ruth Miller, survive.

## <u>History of WarrenCountyIowa – 1987; page 459</u>

Benjamin F. Tate was born in Henrico Co., VA on September 14, 1826. He came to Licking Co., OH with his parents when he was about seven years old. They stayed there for two years and then moved to Delaware Co., IN>

Maria Louisa Beeson was the daughter of Dr. Silas H. Beeson and Charity S. Beeson and was born in Franklin, Wayne Co., IN on September 5, 1834.

Benjamin F. Tate and Maria Louisa Beeson were married March 21, 1852.

Four children were born of this union, John Milton on April 26, 1853, Silas B. on April 9, 1856 and died at the age of two. He was buried beside the trail as they came west. The family settled near Dexter, IA in 1857 as did a good many other Hoosiers. Jahu Beeson Tate was born May 6, 1858 at Dexter. Their daughter Mary Florence arrived May 20, 1864 also at Dexter. Their mother died September 27, 1865 at the age of thirty two.

On September 13, 1866 their father married Louisa Mendenhall. They had five more boys, Arthur K., who died in infancy and Charley L., who died at the age of twenty six. The three who lived to manhood were Elmer C., Archie O., and Frederick H. Mary Florence (better known as Florence0 stayed with her father and stepmother until she was able to make her own way. She worked for an aunt for a number of years for \$1.50 a week. During that time she bought and paid for a New Home sewing machine.

She became acquainted and was engaged to a man by the name of John Cox. He worked at bridge construction. Their wedding date was set for January 8, 1889. Just a week to the day before they were to be married he fell to his death from the bridge he was working on.

Florence's brother, John Tate had met and married Margaret Anderson. When Margaret's brother John came to visit he met Florence and they were married December 23, 1891.

Their home then was southeast of Des Moines where they lived for fourteen years. Two sons were born there, Walter Scott on January 27, 1893 and John Ross on June 11, 1898. In the fall of 1905 they bought a farm one mile east of Cumming in Linn Twp.

In February of 1906 they moved to their new home. Florence was so very homesick for the home she had just left. The new house was just five rooms that were small and had no closets. There was no place to put anything. Where they had lived before she had wonderfully clear spring water but it had to be hauled up a big hill in a barrel. Here she also had good clear well water just outside the door.

On August 13, 1906 their daughter Florence Ruth was born. She always went by her middle name of Ruth. John was eight when she was born and Walter was  $13\frac{1}{2}$ .

Florence became sick that winter and was unable to work for nearly three years. She had an abscessed lung and not much could be done for it at that time. It seemed doubtful that she would live. She used to tell a story about her son John helping. In trying to mop the floor he lifted out all the water possible on the mop and made a run across the floor and hit the baseboard and the water flew. He was also put to churning cream with a dash churn and when the butter was slow in coming he churned with tears running down his cheeks.

She lived to raise her children and to keep up with her share of the work. During threshing time she cooked for as many as thirty men.

She took care of her husband John for almost six years while he was an invalid and was able to do the work and keep house for her two sons until she was about seventy.

After that they had housekeepers to clean the house, do the cooking and watch over Florence. She lived to see her only living grandchild, Ruth (known as Dolly) reach the age of nineteen. When Dolly was born she said she thought she was awful nice but she didn't say anything because she thought people might make fun of her for being so proud.

She lived to be eighty five and died March 19, 1950. She was buried at PleasantRidgeCemetery beside her husband John.
