He had been confined to the hospital about one week and his death was unexpected. He had lived on a farm southwest of Cumming for four years, moving there from Des Moines. Surviving are his widow, one brother and two sisters who live in Portland, Maine. The funeral was held at Dunn's Funeral Home in Des Moines on Tuesday afternoon with the Rev. Dr. A. N. Simpson of the Norwalk Church of Christ, officiating. Interment was in the Orillia cemetery.

Wallace E. Clark

Wallace Edwin Clark, eldest son of the Rev. Charles and Mary (Trask) Clark, was born at Presque Isle in the state of Maine, March 12, 1884, and after a brief illness passed away December 28, 1940, in the Methodist hospital, Des Moines, Iowa, at the age of 56 years, 9 months, and 13 days.

Mr. Clark received his primary education in the public schools, and later took work in the state university located in Orono, Maine.

Mr. Clark, being of an original and inventive mind, applied himself to a number of inventions that became practical especially in the automobile industry. For a time he was a manufacturer not only of his own inventions, but also of the inventions of others.

Mr. Clark went to Chicago, IL. to reside in 1917. In this city he met Miss Julia Elizabeth Miner, a teacher of art in one of the public schools in Chicago, whom he married June 28, 1920. Later he, with his wife, lived for a short time in Des Moines, Iowa. In 1929 he purchased a farm southwest of Norwalk where he lived until the time of his death.

Mr. Clark loved his home and through his skillful management and work he succeeded in making it beautiful and picturesque.

His education was not complete without religion. As a boy he studied his Bible. He was a member of the Methodist church in his home town. Later when he and his wife moved to their farm near Cumming they placed their membership with the Methodist church there.

He was upright in business, and honest in meeting his obligations. He was interested in the good of others and practiced the Golden Rule. He was genial in disposition, loved people, and was uncompromising on questions of right and wrong. He was a good citizen, neighbor and friend.

All through his life he read the Bible and knew its truths and in John's gospel he found his greatest joy. The people he had met over the miles which Mr. Clark had traveled from Maine to Iowa and in places where he had lived have been made better and happier for their journey of life.

Mr. Clark is survived by his widow; one brother, John Clark, and two sisters, Mrs. Frances Powers and Ella Clark, all of Portland, Maine, and a number of other relatives and friends.

The funeral was conducted by the Rev. Dr. Simpson, pastor of the Norwalk Church of Christ, at the Dunn Funeral Home, Des Moines, December 30. Interment was in the Orillia cemetery.
