Irvin Dean Flinn son of Glenn Kettells Flinn and Florida Lorene (Acheson) Flinn was born May 26, 1930 at Waukee, IA; He has three brothers, Earl, born on March 15, 1928, Lewis born March 1, 1929 and Gordon, better known as Ike, born January 20, 1935. He also has one sister, Wilma (Flinn) Beveridge born October 3, 1932.

His parents were farmers. They lived in the Waukee and Earlham area until about 1936. They then moved and spent time on farms in the Osceola, Van Wert and Murray areas.

In 1944 they left the farm and moved to Commerce now part of West Des Moines. Irvin was then fourteen and finished eighth grade in the CommerceSchool.

He then went to work at the Hubbell Farms. When he was sixteen he went to work at Brady Motor Company and in 1948 he went to work at Sanders Motor Company. At this time through a friend he met and married Ruth Miller.

He was drafted into the Army on March 7, 1951. On May 26, 1951 his son Don was born on his 21st birthday. He had six weeks basic training at Ft.
