I give and bequeath to my son Frank Groth my farm of 120 (One hundred and twenty acres) consisting of the SE 4 of NW 4 of Section 9- 40 acres and E 2 of SW 4 of Sec 9 – 80 acres – all lying in Township 76 N Range 27 W together with all appentenances herein to belong to have and to hold the said premises above described, the said Frank Groth himself, his heirs and assigns forever. And I also give and bequeath to my son Frank Groth all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal estate, goods chattels of what nature or kind forever.

And I also give and bequeath to my three daughters the sum of One Thousand dollars to be divided equally between them and the remainder of moneys of which I may be possessed at the time of my decease I bequeath to my son Frank Groth. This will is not to be of any effect until after my decease.
