Edward Earl Jenks was born April 25, 1882 in Cass County, Iowa and died at the Iowa Methodist hospital in Des Moines September 27, at the age of 63 years, 5 months, 2 days.

He was the son of Charles Oscar and Amanda Alice Jenks who, when about eight years after his birth, moved to Warren county. He had resided around the neighborhood of Cumming all but a few years which were spent in Grinnell and the Bear Creek Community near Earlham.
