John W. Lockridge, son of William and Elizabeth Lockridge, was born February 11, 1866, near Spring Hill, Warren County, Iowa, and died September 29, 1943, at his home in Clarkson, Washington, his age being 77 years, 7 months, and 18 days. He remained with his parents in the old home until the time of his marriage.

He was married to Armeda Barkley in March, 1893. They lived on the farm home near Orillia until 1912 when he with his wife moved to a farm home in Idaho, later moving to Clarkson where he lived until his death. His wife preceded him in death in 1939.

John acknowledged Christ as his Savior in the Norwalk Church of Christ and remained faithful to the church all of his life. He was successful in all of his business undertakings, and was charitable towards all.

He leaves to mourn their loss one brother Samuel of Clarkson, Washington, who accompanied his brother's body back home; and two sisters, Sadie (Mrs. F. H. Meader) Los Angeles, California and Vana (Mrs. W. C. Sinclair) Des Moines, and many relatives and friends.

Children born in the same home become separated by thousands of miles, but when the end of this earthly life draws near, they often request that their bodies be laid to rest by the side of their loved ones in the old home cemetery. There is no place like home.

The funeral service was held in the Norwalk Church of Christ by A. N. Simpson. Interment was in the Orillia cemetery.
