In 1903, Andrew migrated with his parents to Verndale, Minnesota where he was engaged in the implement business. In 1919, Andrew moved to Wheaton, Minnesota. Andrew died in an automobile accident, 5 miles from Wheaton, Minnesota.

OBITUARY (The Verndale Sun): ANDREW ATTLESON ACCIDENTLY KILLED - Car Ran Off Grade and Fell On Top Of Him Crushing Him To Death. - Found Tuesday Morning - Word reached here Tuesday of the sad death of Andrew Attleson at Wheaton, Minn., caused from an outomobile accident. He had gone out to do some collecting Monday afternoon and it appears that, he must have been kept out until late and owing to bad lights had been unable to keep the car in the road and had the misfortune to run off a grade killing himself. He was not found until the next morning (Tuesday) and was pinned under the car at that time.

Andrew M. Attleson is well known here havIng been in the implement business here for some time past and about a year ago had sold out here and gone to Wheaton to engage in the same business. He was married a year ago or so to Mrs. Goldie West and together with her two children had gone to Wheaton to make his future home. He was fourty-two years of age at the time of his death and had no children of his own to mourn his loss.

Besides his wife and parents Mr. and Mrs. Ed Aattleson he leaves as mourners four brothers and five sis-ters, the brothers being Ed Attleson of Ia., Hans, John and Tom all of here. The sisters are, Mrs. Nettie Lingle of Montana, Mrs. Martha Munson of Iowa, Mrs. John Heinmiller of Brainard, Minn., Mrs. Arthur Walker and Mrs. Raymond Walker of here, and a host of friends and other relatives. He was always fair in all business dealings and had gained the reputation of being a very succesful dealer while in this locality. He was in the prime of life and was enjoying good health and no doubt would have lived to a great old age had it not been for this one great, accident.

The remaind were brought here Wednesday evening accompanied by Tom, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Walker, and Mr. and Mrs. Ed Attleson. The latter couple had been making their home with Andrew for the past fewweeks and were there at the time of his death. Funeral services will be held today at 2 o'clock in the Lutheran church and burial will be made in the Verndale cemetery. The many friends of the deceased will join with the bereaved relatives in their sorrow.
