Funeral services for Ben Attle-son, 50, were held Monday after-noon at 1:30 from Perry's Chapel and at 2:00 o'clock at St. Olaf's Lutheran Church with the Rev. Harold A. Pearson, pastor of-ficiating.          Mrs. Gerald Bailey sang "Jesus Savior, Pilot Me" and "The Lords Prayer," accompanied on the or-gan by Mrs. Robert Fox. Mrs. Marjorie Woodford, Mrs. Robert Clasen and Mrs. Alfred Jacobson were in charge of the flowers.          Interment was in Crane Creek cemetery with Richard Attleson, Stanley Atleson and Donald Attleson, nephews; and Nordeen Allleson, Alfred Attleson and Al-fred Vikdal, cousins of the decased, were pall hearers.          Honorary pall hearers were co--workers of the Cargill Seed Corn Co.: Bernard McKinley, Oelwein; Vern Baldwin, Nashua; Frank Rochford, Fredericksburg; Ray Britt, Lawler; Herbert Roethler,-North Washington; Martin Hirsch,-lonla; and Ray Shevik and Lester Trusty, New Hampton.          Mr. Attleson died suddenly at 2:55 P. M, Friday, May 10th, at his farm home.
