There is some controversy about Ed's legal name. Some family members are adamant that "Ed E." was his legal name. "Ed" is not a nickname for Edward. Middle initial "E" does not refer to a specific name. The 1910 Census reported his name as Eddie E. Attleson. The 1930 Census reported his name as Edward E. Attleson, occupation - Laborer - Pole Testing (?) Plant. His Obituary gave his name as Edward Attleson.

After their marriage, Ed and Etta lived above his father's General Store in Jerico. Ed moved to his own farm in Jacksonville Township. After a number of years he sold the farm and moved to New hampton, where he purchased an implement business. Ed served as Sheriff of Chickasaw County for two years. He was also employed as a male nurse. In the 1900 Census, Ed was enumerated with John & Sarah Bjondal in Jacksonville Township.

In April 1903, Ed and Amanda moved to a farm near Verndale, Minnesota. Ed retired from farming in 1916 and moved into Verndale. In 1920 Ed was enumerated as the "proprietor" of an implement dealership in New Hampton. By April 1930, he had moved to Anoka, Minnesota .

Ed spoke Norwegian fluently. He learned English when he started to school. On occasion he housed young Norwegian immigrants until they got settled. Ed was an avid hunter and fisherman. Even in his latter years he went out for his annual deer and bear.

The body was brought to Perrys Chapel and funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday at St. Olafs' Lutheran church.

Gertrude Attleson will sing "Nearer the Cross" and John E. Vikdal will sing "The Lord's Prayer."

Burial will be in Graceland cemetery with three nephews, Floyd Munson and lester Munson and three cousins, Stanley Attleson, Erick Attleso, and Ben Attleson as pall bearers.

Edwdrd Attleson, son of Ed and Julia Thompson Attleson was born April 25, 1876 in Jacksonville townshlp, Chickasaw county. He attended the rural schools and on Oct. 3, 1899 he was married to Ettie Amanda Clapper, in New Hampton.

He served as sheriff, of Chickasaw, county for two years, was in the implement business in New Hampton, farmed for a time and was also employed as a male nurse. He resided in Chickasaw county and Anoka, Minn. during his lifetime and the past eight years lived at Marion. Six children were born to this union

Edna has been a member of the Baptist church of New Hampton since July ,1917. Her life was always clean and upright. To her parents she was obedient and respectful at all times. She bore her burdens without any complaint. Those who knew her best testify to the consistency of her Christian life.

She was a member of the class of June 1922, of the New Hampton High School. Since her graduation from high school, she had been teach-ing. She taught 1 year at the Miller school in Jacksonville township. She was teaching this year at the Keisling school, four months of her term being gone which she died.

She had the best of care during her illness. A trained nurse was kept constantly in attendance upon her, but despite that earthly hands could do, death claimed her, and she has gone away for a time from those who loved her.

A short time before she died she called for her pastor, and a very few minutes following the prayer at her bedside, she passed away peaceful! like one falling asleep. Her loved ones were at her bedside when death came.

She has vanished from our sight, but not from our hearts. The mists have dimmed our vision, but the sun will yet shine, and we shall see clearly. We have said goodbye only for a time.

Funeral services were held at the Baptist church, Tuesday afternoon conducted by Rev. I DJ. Bra me. The choir sang, "Safe in the Arms of Jesus" and Mr. and Mrs. A. HO. Shafer sang a duet, "The Homeland."
