Selmar (Sam) Attleson, 71, died Wednesday, Sept. 16, at the Iowa Veterans Home in Marshalltown. Funeral services were held 1:30 p.m: Friday at Immanuel Lutheran Church, rural Lawler, with Pastor Robert Slade officiating. Edith Kolthoff. was organist. Those in attendance at the service joined in singing: "Softly, and Ten-derly", "The King of Love" and "Thee We Adore". Interment was in Crane Creek cemetery with Tom Attleson, Jr. and David Borlaug, Michael Njus, Charles Vikdal, Duane Knutson and Clifford Ferkenstad serving as casketbearers. Graveside military rites were accorded by members of the Fae Stine American Legion Post of New Hampton. Conway Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Selmar T. Attleson was born Jan. 14 1910, in Jacksonville Township, the son of Thomas and Synneva (Vikdal) Attleson. He moved to New Hampton where he was employed.

He was a World War II veteran serving in the U.S. Army. He had spent the last several years at the Iowa Soldiers Home.

He was preceeded in death by his parents. three sisters: Gertrude, Sigrud and Lucille Attleson; eight brothers: Sjur in infancy, Attley, Sjur, Hans, Torkel, Benjamin, Erick and Gustav. He is survived by one brother, Thomas of New Hampton and several nieces and nephews.
