At our March meeting, David Hull of Ottumwa and one of our members, gave a talk on the Internet. He first explained how it got started in the 60's and how with newer and more technology it has expanded and continues to do so daily. Using the computer available to us he demonstrated Web pages, what they contain and how they are set up. Several sites were accessed with each displaying a variety of information. We are considering a Web page for our society as it would be another way to get information to genealogists not just nationwide, but world wide. It may take a while, but David has volunteered to help us.

We receive many queries each month. I would like to remind everyone to enclose a SASE or at least a SAS postcard for answers. We are a volunteer group with limited assets. Also, some of the queries are hard to read or understand. Sometimes an ancestor chart would help to clarify what is needed. Members are allowed free queries, but non-members should include \$1.50 for each request to be published. Remember a published query will travel many places to be seen by many eyes. So it could be a cheaper way to research. I recall one of mine was not fruitful for 5 full years, but it finally gave me answers.

Library hours have been cut due to budget. The hours are Tues-Fri 11:00AM to 5:00PM and Sat 11:00AM to 2:00PM. RAGBRAI is coming to town on July 24th so that might not be an ideal day to visit the library because of lack of parking. To out of staters, RAGBRAI stands for the Des Moines Register's Annual Great Bike Ride Across Iowa IV. The town is gearing up for a big day and night as upwards of 15,000 people are expected to spend the night. So the city and county are plannin', fixin' and sprucin' up for lots of visitors.







Soap Creek Township

First settlements made in 1843. p. 599

First marriage was in 1843 between Madison McIntyre and Harriet Martin. Were married by W. W. Rankin, the first justice in the township. p. 599

First female child was Caroline Blankenship

First regular physician was Dr. Barron, of Bloomfield.

First minister was William Brooks, of the M. Church. p. 599

First school house buit was the Harbour school house. p. 599

Salt Creek Township

The first mill in the county was built by the government in this township, in 1837. It was destroyed by the flood in 1838, rebuilt in 1839, and was consumed by fire in 1840.. p. 599.

First marriage in this township was between Daniel Woodin and Emily Paris. p. 599

First birth of a female child was Sarah Conaway, daughter of Aquilla and Margaret Conaway, and who died three months afterward, and was buried in the Litner graveyard.

The first regular physician was Dr. Varron, the second was Dr. Finely, the third was Dr. Greenleaf. p. 599

First religious service was held in a log shool house near the Litenr graveyard, by Franklin New, a Methodist minister. p. 599

First school was taught by Grant Tousey; ot was a sibscro[topm scjpp; wotj abpit 15 at about \$2.00 a term. p. 599

First school ouse was built of logs, in district # 5, in the year 1844.p. 599

First weaving or making of cloth was done by a Mrs. Bigsby. p. 600
