Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847.

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *His* favor, numbered

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *Samuel Van Emon* assignee

of said John Manning, and to his Heirs the North East fractional quarter of the North East quarter of Section two, in Township Ninety one North, of Range thirty West in the District of Texas subject to sale at Fort Dodge Loan containing forty seven Acres, and seventy four hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND

TO HOLD the said *Part of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Samuel Van Emon, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
