Dodge Iowa containing forty acresaccording to the official plan of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in which same
made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED unto the presents DO. GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said
Thomas M Reedand to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges,
immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Thomas M Reed

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
