Whereas *Cornelia Green Doolittle* of *Orangetown* County *New York*

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of THE REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE of *Fort Dodge* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

*Cornelia Green Doolittle* according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

*the East half of the North East quarter and the North West quarter of the North East quarter of Section eight in Township ninety one North of Range twenty nine West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Fort Dodge Iowa containing one hundred and twenty acres*

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Cornelia Green Doolittle*

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said *Cornelia Green Doolittle*

and to her heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

*Cornelia Green Doolittle* and to her heirs and assigns forever.
