Ron owned and operated a corn sheller, and worked at a service station. In 1967, he drove a semi for the Henry G.

Nelsen Truck Line and later with the 8-Way Truck Line. He also drove cross-country for the Double "S" and V-T Truck Lines. He also worked for Paul Simonsen on the farm during spring work and harvest for six years. Ron tried to retire in 1991 but ended up working for the Hancock Fertilizer Co. He also drove a grain truck for the Hancock Elevator and helped Bob Emken farm the Carse farm for over 10 years. He finally retired in 2004 on his 78th birthday, and then began "running errands" for Gary Madden and Akers Auto Repair. He died Sept. 23, 2006, at Myrtue Medical Center at age 80 years, six months and 19 days.

Ron was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his brother, Gene Sornsen (Maxine); two nephews, Lynn Sornsen (Kari) of Dallas, TX and Steve Sornsen (Linda) of Ames; four great-nieces and great-nephew, Brooke of Las Vegas, NV; Ashley and Mallory Sornsen of Ames; Kirsten and Joshua Frank of Dallas, TX; and other relatives.
